# **Intuit Connectivity Types Explained**

There are three connectivity types across QuickBooks, Mint and Quicken and they consist of Web Connect, Direct Connect and Express Web Connect. Please see the <a href="Intuit Support Website">Intuit Support Website</a> for additional information on their products

#### What method can I use?

The connection method that can be used depends on which Intuit product the information is being brought into.

Below are the methods that Intuit allows to bring in transactions.



**Web Connect** – This is the connectivity type that begins in Digital Business Banking. Download a .qbo (QuickBooks) or .qfx (Quicken) file and then import that file into QuickBooks or Quicken. This process does not require credentials to be entered in Quicken or QuickBooks since the file download occurs in the online banking site.

### How to upload transactions into QuickBooks Online


**Direct Connect** – This is an automatic update options that communicates directly with Intuit. Users do not need to log in directly to your online banking site to use this connectivity type. Once connected, updates will occur when the end user initiates a new download request from within the product.

### **How to use Direct Connect?**

Locate your DirectConnect ID by selecting your name in the menu, then select "Profile Maintenance". This will be your user ID in Quickbooks. The password is the same as your online banking password

## ("How to use Direct Connect" Continued...)



**Aggregation** (Express Web Connect in Quicken)- Unlike Direct Connect, Aggregation retrieves transactions from your online banking site. Intuit creates and manages this connectivity type.

<u>Products that support Aggregation</u>: QuickBooks Win/Mac 2022, QuickBooks Online, Mint and Quicken\* (\*referred to as Express Web Connect in Quicken)

# **How to use Express Web Connect?**

Use the same Company ID, User ID and password that one would use to log into the Digital Business Banking platform. You will be prompted for a One-Time Password during the process, and each time Intuit would like to connect to your Digital Business Banking profile.
